


"not having enough to eat to meet energy requirements" (WFP 2015)

Hunger in the World Distribution of hungry people, 2014-2016



The Concept of Global Governance



Definition of Governance as analytical perspective (Benz; Lütz; Schimank; Simonis 2007:9)

"[Governance] stands for all forms and mechanisms of coordination between more or less autonomous actors whose actions are interdependent (...)" (own translation)




Definition of Global Governance as normative perspective (WHO 2015)

"(…) global governance is thought to be an international process of consensus-forming which generates guidelines and agreements that affect national governments and international corporations."


Global Food Security Governance What is Food Security?








Global Food Security Governance Progress




Number of undernourished people (in million)














